Adderall XR - Adderall XR is an extended release dose form that is a combination of various salts of amphetamine and dextroamphetamine. It is used in the treatment of ADHD. Amphetamines are stimulants of the CNS and are controlled substances. Side effects include: loss of appetite, insomnia, GI complaints and nervousness. Dry mouth and metallic taste may infrequently occur. Amphetamines should not be taken with meperidine and may produce serious side effects when combined with tricyclic antidepressants or within 14 days of taking a monoamine oxidase inhibitor. Dental Clinical Concerns: Determine if the patient is using any other drugs including herbal remedies or other products or treatment modalities for ADHD. If possible reduce the risk of stress and anxiety during dental treatment. Check blood pressure.

Dilantin - Dilantin or Phenytx (phenytoin sodium) is an anticonvulsant used in epilepsy for tonic-clonic seizures and status epilepticus. Other uses include trigeminal neuralgia, dysrhythmias and for seizures other than epilepsy. Dental Clinical Concerns: The most common dental side effect is gingival overgrowth. Other side effects include GI complaints, drowsiness and skin rash. Severe hematological adverse effects rarely occur. Drug interactions include increased blood levels with used concurrently with ketoconazole, itraconazole, fluconazole and metronidazole. Hepatotoxicity may occur with chronic high doses of acetaminophen. Decreased effects have been noted with corticosteroids, barbiturates, doxycycline, and carbamazepine.
